10th Au Cœur du Niger General Assembly



On Wednesday, October 7th, the *Au Coeur du Niger* Association Committee presented its activities in Niger along with accounts and changes made within the committee during its 10th General Assembly, held in the presence of 47 people who were kind enough to make the trip.

A Statement of Satisfaction and Honour was awarded to Mr. Charles Phillot for his 10 years serving as co-President alongside Ms. Solange Berset, then incumbent Association President. A very warm tribute was paid for the following:

- Dedication and service since the founding of the Association in 2010;
- Attention and assistance given to more than 300 orphaned children, albinos and child-mothers who have been schooled, educated and trained at the *Après-demain* Centre, as well as their families and entourage;

- ➤ Valuable technical counsel and contacts for the construction of the *Après-demain* Centre in 2013;
- > Positive atmosphere and excellent collaboration within the committee;
- ➤ Presence and rigor throughout 49 Committee Meetings, 10 General Assemblies, seven support evenings, two concert evenings with the Armaillis de la Gruyère Choir and six booths, to name a few;
- Good advice and contacts, as well as the extensive trust placed in the founder, making her dreams a reality!

Gratitude also went to Mr. Frédéric Chobaz, who was part of the Association Committee from 2018 to 2020 as technical and logistical manager for work and construction at the Centre. He was recognised for his deep commitment and meticulous follow-up of the renovation and construction of the two-story school complex in 2018, expansion of the infirmary, and the new kindergarten that were finished this year.

To make up for their departure, we had the joy and honour if introducing new people to join the *Au Coeur du Niger* team as the faces of our Association! Mr. Grégoire Piller, a notary lawyer, has accepted the position of President. He is fully committed to the children of the Zinder region and we look forward to the many upcoming meetings and assemblies that will take place under his presidency.

Ms. Amalia Risse, from La Roche, will reinforce Events alongside Ms. Anita Clerc from Fribourg. Ms Risse is already enchanting us with her many ideas and creativity!

Mr. Jean-Marc Egger returns to the Association Committee after having supported as a sponsor in the early days of the Association. I am extremely grateful for such friendly commitment that will ensure the continuation of *Au Coeur du Niger* in a beautiful atmosphere and with a deep sense of serenity.

I am ever appreciative of Mr. Jörg Stämpfli's professional commitment, without whom hundreds of postal boxes would not have gone to Niger. Thanks to Mr. Stämpfli, three containers made the sea and land journey to Zinder, and without his expertise the obstacles peppering my journeys to and from Geneva would have been innumerable. He organised and managed events that ran seamlessly!

Special mention to Mr. Cédric Margueron, without whom it would be impossible to present accounts, prepare budgets, control payments and expenses so that our dear and very professional Accountant, Gilbert Butty in Ursy, can present his report during our assemblies!

The greatest pleasure that these children could have brought to me at the *Après-demain* Centre was the signing of a contract with one of the young students who had been welcomed there, and it happened last September, during my stay in Zinder.

Rayana had joined the Association in 2010 as a child-mother with two very young children; 10 years later, she received an official work contract as a seamstress, teaching girls at the Centre. She passed her tests as a seamstress two years in a row, and can now teach other girls at the Centre. We hope that even more girls and boys from the Centre will sign contracts in the coming years, and will be the much hoped-for future. Five girls received their sewing diploma during my last stay in Niger: Rayana, Jamila, Samira, Mariama and Zara! CONGRATULATIONS to them and keep up the good work!

Abdourahamane has an endless list of work to show them, and the older boys are eager to get involved and learn the basics. These are the future candidates for contracts as technical assistants and valuable workers, no doubt about it!

It is very important to value and motivate the boys at an early age, to foster an interest in small jobs around the Centre, which helps them channel their vast energy. This way they feel useful, and are happy to show off their successes! Abdourahamane is really very skilled at teaching

masonry, as well as the various repair and maintenance jobs that need to be done daily in and around the Centre.

Daily life and safety in Zinder

In December 2019, we fired our Director for various types of professional misconduct. A teacher by trade, he did not have the potential to manage such a Centre, or the ability to see the needs of the Centre and its staff. We hired an accountant in October 2019 to take over accounting and human resources. Unfortunately, the latter has just given her resignation and will go to work for another NGO. It is very difficult to find good, reliable and dedicated local staff that one can rely on. I have discovered and experienced over the years that handling the children is not the most difficult task, instead it is human resources.

Those who work in corporate HR will most certainly agree with me. When I was employed, I didn't realize what it means to be an employer; to manage different personalities, sensibilities, cultures, individual and group issues, to find solutions, maintain relationships, working conditions, to seek funds, to ensure salaries, social charges, pregnancies, accidents, illnesses, replacement staff, to respond to diverse and multiple demands, and to think about sustainability. I would, therefore, like to take this opportunity to congratulate and very warmly and humbly thank all the independent people and entrepreneurs from around the world!

During my stay in September, we spent time recruiting for the empty accounting position. We received six applications and selected two of them, which corresponded to the specifications for the position. We retained a young woman, who was given an aptitude test by the accountant. She started her trial work on Monday, and on Friday of the same week, her husband told her that she would not be coming back to work in the Centre. The new accountant had left the Centre one day with her hijab on her arm, and her husband could not accept that our rules (of a secular school) did not require employees to wear one. Therefore, we are looking for another accountant; let the games begin!

Following the murder of six young French humanitarian workers and two Nigerian employees of the French NGO, security has become unstable. Unfortunately, I had not been able to return to Niger since April, first because of the novel coronavirus, which had closed the airports and borders of Niger, and then by this unfortunate human tragedy, 60 km from the capital Niamey. I am always very careful when I go into the field, and gather information from my security contacts in Niger, France and elsewhere before and as I travel.

For this reason, I vacated the house we had been renting for 10 years. Ever since 2010, I had been living in Zinder at first for three-quarters, then for half of the year to follow up on Association activities and projects. This year, I was only able to go twice, and for a mere three weeks each time. The Minister of the Interior of Niger and the Governor of the Region of Zinder will provide solid counsel for future visits.

Following the attack against the French and the many travel obstacles to Niger (Air France had cancelled my last flight to Geneva again) due to the coronavirus pandemic, I have thought a lot about the current situation. For years I have been asked to think about the "sustainability" of the Centre, which was very dear to our late Honorary President, Dr. Rolland-Yves Mauvernay. An ideal scenario would be to join forces with another NGO that also works in Zinder. I contacted three structures to discuss possibilities that would allow everyone to ensure a better foundation for Zinder, to share and join forces.

On my return to the capital Niamey, I met the Director of the Swiss Cooperation Office, who encouraged me in this direction, "instead of everyone doing their own little activities in their own corner," as I had often been told. I am finally ready for this and am looking forward to being able to join forces, to unite our resources in terms of infrastructure, local employees and vehicles, all the while maintaining our own activities and structures.

Working together under the best conditions and with the appropriate supervision contributes to collective success, mutual dignity and respect. It's a never-ending quest... but it's worth the effort! This effort is collective and based on solidarity!

Jonathan and Nicolas' humanitarian action - T-shirt sale

Jonathan and Nicolas are two young and dynamic students from Gruyère. Through their association, RW-Solidarité, which they created to support humanitarian aid activities targeting *Au Coeur du Niger* children, they involved several schools in Gruyère (Orientation Cycle of La Tour-de-Trême, Bulle, Riaz and the Collège du Sud in Bulle).
